2013 Total tonnage from Clyde 498,465.18 and regional 18,234.93
Tonnage tipped Jan 2014 – 43,954.00 and Feb 2014 - 38,713.36.

Total Jan – Feb '14: 2,791,109 sm³ LFG (2,574,846 through station, 216,263 flared)

Total 2013: 16,731,830sm³ (15,354,815 station, 1,377,014 flared)

Total 2012: 15,760,550sm³ (14,502,621 station, 1,257,929 flared)

Over summer with hotter weather, the generators tendered to trip more easily.

Ben Quill has been appointed Landfill Engineer responsible for gas capture initiatives, which involve leachate management and management of the extraction infrastructure.

Amila Wijedasa, an engineer with previous experience with large generators. He joined the Woodlawn team mid February. His primary role will be to manage the maintenance objectives and improvements at the Power Station

Odour Management

Terry Shultz from Odour Unit attended TADPAI meeting Feb 10 to give overview of how they investigated the odour sources and the results and comparisons from previous audit conducted in 2012

Odour Diaries will be distributed with training in the following months to specific people and locations – these locations are yet to be determined

The 2012 and 2013 odour audit is available on the Veolia Website for public viewing

Woodlawn Mechanical Biological Treatment Facility (MBT)

Construction Tenders for facility went out in January with closing date of 4 April 2014.

3 types of outputs will be generated from the facility – Metals sent for recycling, Compost to rehabilitate Woodlawn mine site and residual waste, which will be landfilled in the void

DS – is aware there will be Section 94 contributions, he asked whether the contributions will be maintained in respect to host fees and applicable contribution to the Veolia Mulwara Trust. HG stated that VES provided a response to the General Manager of GMC regarding this matter.

The Woodlawn MBT Facility is set to start operating early 2016.

Other Matters

Website - LM confirming where on the VES website the records of our complaints are held. HG mentioned he would look into this matter

Procedures - LM asked about the management of non conforming waste coming to site from regional areas. He stated that the procedure is the same for the operations at Clyde.

Woodlawn Aquaculture Facility – 3rd batch of 1200 fingerlings received last week. NSW Food authorities audited the procedures and facility and have given approval to market and sell the fish.

HG suggested a tour of fish farm for committee members, at beginning of next meeting.

Bungendore Road – GMC have provided VES with a plan to start Line marking and shoulder sealing in first week of April. Road Safety Audit and plan determine that that no climbing lane is required from Crisps Creek. From the GMC/Palerang boundary to Bungendore, road widening is required in the event VES receives more than 30kt from that direction.

Palerang Transfer station facility, 3 sites around the area – Bungendore, Macs Reef Road and Braidwood. Palerang have advised VES that the facilities will be operating by years end and expect volumes to be delivered to Woodlawn
