Welcome: The Chair opened meeting and welcomed attendees including round the table introductions.

Business Arising:

- Denzil Sturgiss accepted as 2nd Delegate from Goulburn Mulwaree Council.
- Community Liaison Committee Charter and member selection criteria were discussed.

Woodlawn Operational Update:

Waste/Generation Data YTD (to Jan 31st 2017)

WBE Generation

- Generator 7 will soon be commissioned and operational by the end of 2017. Existing 6 Generators will need to run consistently before the 7th Generator will be utilised.
- Gas extraction and capture efficiency has improved significantly. Well design and capping system have contributed to a now robust system.

Odour Complaints

- Complaints relating to odour have declined.
- The waste profiling and well design has meant the management of liquid has improved
- An application is due to be submitted to the Department of Planning for construction of new Leachate Treatment Plant.
- The bio-filtration trial with the EPA expires in March 2017 and the odour audit will determine if trial is to continue.

Train Management

- Henry Gundry explained recent changes to train movement in particular parking of 2nd train in Village. Saturday trains will commence from Saturday 25th Feb, 2017.

Mechanical Biological Treatment Facility:

- Construction is close to completion with wet commissioning currently taking place.
- Final staff numbers for the project have been determined, however indications that 15 operational staff and management will be required.

Other Matters

- Henry Gundry introduced Elton Consulting; a town planning firm that has been engaged to conduct a workshop/meeting for Tarago residents on March 14th 2017.
- Cid Riley (TADPAI) provided update on progress of odour survey including statistics of responses received thus far. Final findings will be released in Tarago Times.
- Cr Margaret O'Neill queried reason for change of time to 5.30pm for future meetings. This will be addressed with the committee and addressed in the Charter.
- Larry Meng confirmed that the GMC Supervisory Licence will be cancelled; timing of this is yet to be known.
